Me and the IGRS



- Just over thirty years ago I started a three year stint in London
- I had been researching my families since 1988
- Slightly more of my ancestors come from Ireland than anywhere else
- I had made some good progress on one of my Anglo-Irish lines (the CROKER family)
- I sought out and joined the IGRS
- For the remainder of my time in London most Saturday afternoons were spent in the basement of the Irish Club

Me and the IGRS (cont)



- There I met and learnt from some notable Irish genealogists
- One of the larger than life characters was Michael Leader
 - One of the tasks he set himself was to compile transcriptions of all extant Church of Ireland parish registers for County Cork.
 - He had worked extensively with Rosemary ffolliot who is well known for her work on newspaper abstracts.
 - Michael died in Australia in 1998
 - There is a article you can download for free in Volume 10 No 2 of the Irish Genealogist the journal of the IGRS

Me and the IGRS (cont)



Another of the people I met at that time is Roz McCutcheon

- We have collaborated over the past thirty years
- In 2007 Roz and I negotiated the structure of the Registry of Deeds Index Project Ireland.
- I have supplied Roz with many newspaper extracts included in the IGRS Newsletter that she edits
- I was able to catch up with the IGRS in 2002 on a work trip
- Most years between then and COVID I was able to visit the IGRS

Me and the IGRS (cont)



- I was elected a fellow of the IGRS in 2007
- I have been the IGRS webmaster with a focus on databases for over a dozen years
- Databases I have created and added to the IGRS website include:
 - Carrick-on-Suir Census 1799
 - Census substitute Oldcastle and Moylagh
 - Dublin Directory 1775
 - Dublin Directory 1803

IGRS history



- Founded in 1936 under leadership of Fr Wallace Clare
- Partly in response to the loss of information in the 1922 fire in the Public Record Office in Dublin
- Since its foundation it has built up a wonderful library of books and manuscripts relevant to Irish family history
- Its Journal *the Irish Genealogist* has been published annually since 1937
- Members also receive a monthly e-bulletin and twice yearly newsletter

- The IGRS website allows you to purchase membership and off-prints of the Irish Genealogist
- It has information about the society, activities and data
- Some data is available to anyone and some is only available to logged on paid-up members

Births deaths and marriages



- Earlier I mentioned Roz McCutcheon
- Roz has gathered a lot information to assist finding about early Irish births deaths and marriages
- This information is available under the Resources then Unique resources part of the menu
- The marriages database (110,023 records) is open access and, the births (47,895) and deaths (32684) databases are only available for logged-on members
- Where the source is the Registry of Deeds there is a link to the abstract of the memorial and then to the image on FamilySearch

Directories



- There are a number of directories of the site, Some transcriptions and some are databases
- Dublin directory 1803 is open access and the 1775 member only

Census and substitutes



- Two of the larger census databases are the 1799 Carrickon-Suir census and the Oldcastle census substitute.
