**CHILDREN MUST BE SUPPORTED.**

**PLEA OF INABILITY.**

Catherine Friedrichsen, of 56 Beach Street, Port Melbourne, proceeded against her husband, Frederick Friedrichsen, before Messrs. Smith and Francis, J.'sP., at the Court on Monday, for leaving five children without adequate means of support. Mrs Friedrichsen gave evidence. They had been married for 23 years, and there were eight children, but the eldest girl was able to work. Her husband had left her, and was engaged in Melbourne at a restaurant where he was receiving 35/- per week. In addition to not supporting witness he came down occasionally and stole things from the house. Once he got a bottle of whisky and sprinkled it over her, and then told the customers she had been drinking. To Mr. Stephens: She called it thieving his coming into the house and taking things which she had paid for. She couldn't say whether her husband had a rupture, and in consequence was unable to do much work. She had only been told he was getting 35/- a week as a full cook; but knew a grill cook was entitled to more. Mr. Stephens said he would prove that defendant was only getting £1 a week as a potterer in the kitchen, and was subject to dismissal at a moment's notice. He was physically unable to pay anything towards their support.

Alf. Ernest Petersen said he was the proprietor of the Chelsea dining rooms. When he bought the business a few weeks back defendant was a cook, but didn't suit him as he suffered from a rupture and at times was unable to work. He was now paying him £1 per week in addition to his board for preparing vegetables and pottering about the kitchen. To Mr. Nolan : Cooks were not under a Wages Board. He employed five hands in the kitchen. Defendant, an elderly man, entered the witness-box and made a rambling statement. He had been given 5/- to clear out. His wife wore silk dresses and diamonds which ought to go towards supporting the children. He only earned £1 per

week, and was suffering from an enlarged rupture. His wife was doing alright in the shop. The Magistrates ordered Friedrichsen to contribute 2/6 per week towards each child, and find a surety of £10 for the due fulfilment, in default one month's imprisonment. £1/3/6 costs were granted.

**Victorian Police Gazette 17 July 1895**

Mrs. Catherine FRIEDRICHSEN has applied to the Honorable the Chief Secretary for a permit for a travelling side show, and has been informed that it is not customary to grant a permit for such purposes, but the police will not interfere so long as the entertainments are conducted with due regard to the morality and safety of the public, and with the consent of the local municipal authorities.

FREDERICKSON, Mrs. Catherine of Richmond. Applied to run a travelling show in 1895; 'she is a lady boxer, girls are high kickers and songsters, men heavyweight lifters and sword swallowers'.
