THE MANNING.

(From the Manning River News, Aug 30.) We are informed that an old and much-respected inhabitant of this district, Mr. Archibald Beattie senr., died at his residence on Bo Bo Creek, on Thursday night last, after an illness of about a fortnight. It is stated that the immediate cause of death was obstinate constipation of the bowels, but Mr. Beattie had been otherwise afflicted for several months, during which period he had twice gone to Newcastle in quest of medical assistance. He has left behind him a widow and several sons and daughters, all married and settled comfortably in life, together with numerous friends, some of them of many years standing, to mourn their loss. The deceased was emphatically an honest man, truthful, and straight forward in all his dealings, and of such a character it has been said it is "the noblest work of God."

On Saturday night last Mrs. Archibald Beattie, sen., Kimbriki, an old and highly esteemed resident of this district, passed away, at the advanced age of 75 years. Her remains were interred in the Tinonee cemetery beside those of her husband, on Monday last, and were followed to their last resting place by a large concourse of relatives and friends. The deceased has left a large family of sons and daughters, all comfortably settled.
