He has left behind him a widow and several sons and daughters, all married and settled comfortably in life, together with numerous friends, some of them of many years standing, to mourn their loss. The de- ceased was emphatically an honest man, truthful, and straight forward in all his dealings, and of such a character it has been said it is " the noblest work of God."
