21: Sacred to the memory of John PAUL lawful son to William PAUL & Margaret BRUCE sometime in Jackston. He was b. 3 May 1775 & d. 13 Nov 1794 aged 19 years 6 months. This monument is erected to his memory at the desire & at the expense of his above named parents (Bottom) 8 lines of verse.

22: In memory of William PAUL late farmer Lethenty d. 8 Apr 1812 aged 43. His dau Catherine d. 26Dec 1834 aged 24. Ratchel (sic) WEIR his spouse d 22 Nov 1866 aged 99. Their sons William sometime farmer of Templand, Culsalmond d. 4 Jan 1889 aged 82; John d. 16 Nov 1895 aged 84; George d. Ayr 6 Mar 1896 aged 88. Erected by John PAUL millwright Aberdeen in memory of his forefathers & uncles.

30: Erected by Elizabeth FERGUSON in memory of her husband George PAUL farmer & miller in Mill of Mounie d. 15 June 1846 aged 52. Their sons John d. 9 Aug 1836 aged 4 yrs 6 mths., William d. 16 Apr. 1847 aged 3 yrs 6 mths., James d. 4 Aug 1847 aged 11 yrs 6mths. Above Elizabeth FERGUSON d. 11 Mar 1862 aged 59. Their sons Arthur d. 11 July 1868 aged 27, George d. 27 Apr 1880 aged 50.

31: Here lies intered (sic) the body of Jean SMYTH d. 14 Dec 1763 aged 63. She was first wife of Adam PAUL and afterwards the wife of Adam THOMAON both farmers in Pittinon. Also the body of the said Adam THOMSON d. 4 Nov 1783* aged 68. (*83 corrected – stone regouged there)

45: In Memory of Anne PAUL wife of Alexander MILNE farmer in Wicketslap d. 13 Oct 1841 aged 78. Their son John d. 22 Oct 1841 aged 42. Above Alexander MILNE d 25 Aug 1854 aged 90. Their grandson James MILNE d 13 Dec 1865 aged 31. Their son James MILNE farmer Easter Saphock d 28 Mar 1883 aged 79. His son John farmer Kirkstyle d 23 Jan 1892 aged 52. Ann PETER widow of said James MILNE Easter Saphock d 20 Oct 1897 aged 88, their dau. Mary d 1 Aug 1907 aged 57.

117: To the memory of John KEMP late farmer of South side if Oldcraig d 2 Apr 1891 aged 74, Jean PAUL his spouse d 3 July 1788 aged 67. George KEMP their son d 15 Jan 1795 aged 29. This monument is erected by John KEMP, also their son James KEMP farmer in Wicketslap d Sept 1823 aged 65, his spouse Elisabeth GERGUSON d in Apr 1830 aged 72. Also James KEMP son of John KEMP in Mains of Glack d in Aug 1836 aged 15.

A: Sacred to the memory of Adam GRAY sometime farmer in Newtown of Mounie d 15 Dec 1829 in 87th year & Elspet PAUL [?bpt 24 Mar 1756] his spouse d 1 Nov 1838 in 86th year. This stone is placed over the ashes of his revered & respected parents, by Adam GRAY late of the Island of Jamaica on his return to his native country, in the year 1839. He was afterwards proprietor of Fingask, in this parish and d in Aberdeen 12 June 1845 aged 65 & was buried in this grave, esteemed by his friends and at peace with mankind.

B: Here lies the bodys of John & James SELBIE & their mother Elizabeth PAUL hoping that their souls are in the Mansions of Bliss.
